Donate through your salary

Donating through your salary (or payroll giving) is a means for employees to help protect vulnerable children in a very simple way.

All your company needs to do is set up a scheme that enables you to donate through your salary. This involves signing a contract with a Government approved agency, such as the [Charities Aid Foundation](#).

Once the scheme has been set up, individual employees can decide how much they would like to donate each pay day. The money is then automatically taken from their pay packets before they are taxed.
